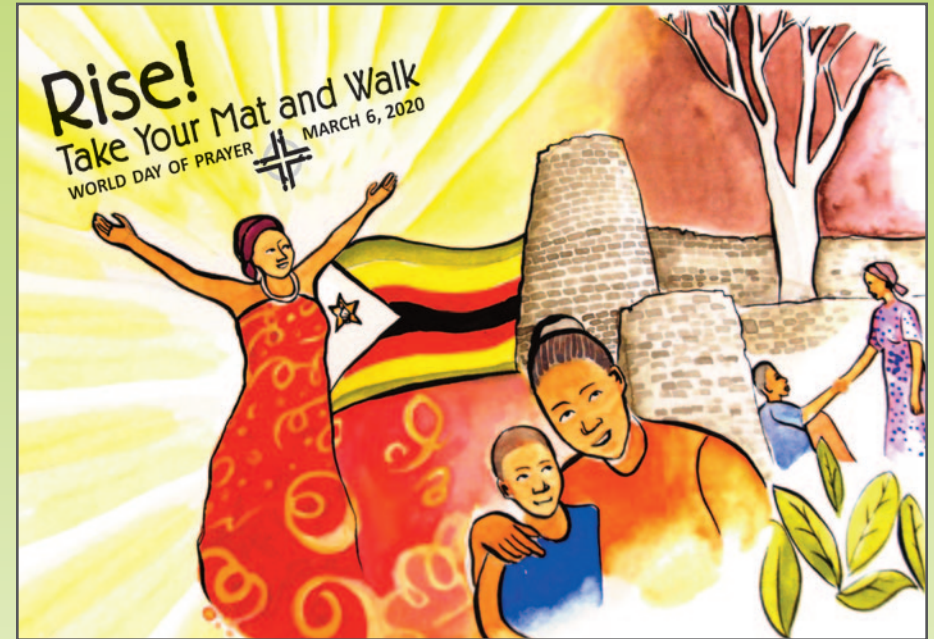

Prayer of Confession

Leader 2: Merciful God, we come before you as a nation, recognizing that we need a change.

Leader 3: We have sinned against you and our sisters and brothers through our negligent words and actions.

Leader 1: We have disobeyed you and done things that we should not have done.

All: We confess our wrongdoings and ask you for courage to change. With your forgiveness, in your grace, hear our prayer.

Leader 2: We see women and children suffering in poverty, hunger, and violence.

All: Grant us compassion to help those who are suffering.

Leader 1: There is a lack of integrity in our lives. We fail to love and to unite those who are divided for reasons of ethnicity, language, or political views.



All: Forgive us and heal our hearts and minds.
